WHEREAS, once the municipal pool has been constructed the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission may levy a maximum fee of \$20 annually on each household within the district for the operation of the pool district; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District is to improve, operate and maintain a municipal swimming pool within the boundaries of the district.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved by the Whitehall Town Council that the following rules shall govern the relationship between the Town of Whitehall and the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District:

- The Whitehall Town Council shall advertise for positions on the three member Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission and shall thereafter appoint the initial three members of the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission. Pool Maintenance District Commissioners must be a minimum of 18 years of age and reside within the Town of Whitehall.
- If more than 3 persons have applied for a seat on the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission, the Whitehall Town Council may have the option of placing the issue on the next regular Whitehall election ballot. If an election is held, the candidates will run at-large and the top three vote-getters will be elected to the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission.
- The initial terms of the Commissioners shall begin on the date of their appointment or election and end on January 1, 2010.
- In the event of a vacancy on the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission, the Town Council may appoint a new Pool District Commissioner who will serve the remainder of the term of the vacated position.

- An appointed member of the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission may be removed by the Whitehall Town by a 2/3 majority vote.
- A member of the Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission who has been elected by general ballot may not be removed by action of the Whitehall Town Council.
- The Whitehall Pool Maintenance District Commission shall conduct its business, including the collection of the annual levy and disbursement of funds, through the Town of Whitehall and the Town Clerk.
- The Commission shall fix the time for holding regular meetings, but it shall meet at least once in the months of May, June, July, August and September. The Commission shall keep minutes of its meetings on file with the Town Clerk for public review.
- The duty of the Commission shall be to levy and collect the annual fee to be used for improvement, operation and maintenance of the Whitehall pool facility. The Commission shall prepare and submit an annual budget to the Town Council for its review. The budget will be kept on file with the Town Clerk.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Agency Clerk is authorized and directed to submit to the Board the compensation deferred by each participating employee in accordance with Title 19. Chapter 50, Montana Code Annotated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the board will hold the deferred compensation funds invested pursuant to this resolution and contract in a trust, custodial account or insurance contract for the exclusive benefit of plan participants and their beneficiaries. The plan's administrator may allocate any necessary costs against the assets and interest earnings of each participant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that neither the Board nor the Agency shall be financially liable for any investment losses incurred.

(20 days after first publication of notice)
